An At-A-Glance Guide to Becoming a Strong Candidate for DPT Admission



- Identify the primary and secondary programs to which you want to apply.
- Review the websites of programs to which you intend to apply.
- Make sure that you meet or exceed all program requirements:
 - Have you taken all of the prerequisite courses?
 - Is your GPA high enough?
 - Do you have sufficient clinical observation hours?
 - Have you taken the GRE?
- Do not call the PT program without having reviewed the program's website.
- Apply via PTCAS early (check the program application dates for individual programs).
- Attend any available open houses/information sessions:
 - Get to know the faculty members and allow them to get to know you (at least by name recognition).
 - Dress professionally.
- If possible, take courses recommended by the program—even if they are not required.
- Take the application essay very seriously! Faculty members review essays and critically assess how students write with respect to organization, reasoning, grammar, punctuation, etc.
- Often the application process is weighted, meaning higher GPAs and GREs are awarded more points. Do the best you can in all areas to maximize your overall score.
- If the program conducts interviews, always participate and dress professionally.
- Prepare for the interview:
- Review the APTA Vision and Code of Ethics.
- Prepare to answer questions like, "Where do you see the profession in five years?" or, "Where do you see yourself in five years?"
- Come with questions to ask the faculty about the program:
- Review the program's history and mission.
- Read faculty profiles and research interests.
- Be prepared to defend why you are the one that should be accepted over other individuals with the same credentials.
- Be yourself, smile, and don't forget to breathe during an interview process!
