The Festival of Fine Arts is a long-running tradition at Florida Southern College. As of 2015, the series will be entering its 51st year of bringing valuable musical and theatrical performances to the school and surrounding community. This collection also includes materials from the “Vagabonds” series: Florida Southern College’s theatrical program.

Scope & Content Note

The FFA and Vagabonds series includes programs and supplemental materials (e.g. photographs, press releases) relating to most performances presented by the Florida Southern College music and theatre departments. In some cases, due to the age and/or lack of historical judiciousness, original materials may not be present. This is especially the case between the years 2010 and 2014.
