

Housing Selection Update for Fall 2025

Last spring, students' and parents' feedback indicated that students would benefit if the College were to move the housing selection window to a time that does not overlap with final exams. Separating housing selection from final exams, students said, will allow students to focus on academic preparation.



This week, in response to that feedback, current students received information regarding a new timeline for housing selection. Please <u>click here</u> to view the email that students received. Housing Selection for Fall 2025 will now begin on May 12, after final exams.

General Housing Selection Timeline:

- April 7: Housing Selection Application Opens on the Portal
- April 21: Deadline for Housing Selection Application
- May 1: Time slots are released AND Roommate Form Opens on the Portal
- May 5 9: Spring billing & summer move-in confirmation week & prep for opening of housing selection
- May 12 16: First week of selections*
- May 19 23: No selection times Medical Accommodation Students will be assigned
- May 26 30: Second week of selections**
- June 2 6: Third week of selections
- June 9 13: Fourth week of selections
- June 16 20: Fifth week of selections***

*Historically, students assigned this week have 100+ hours earned at FSC; Garden, Star, and Lake Morton are usually filled within the first week.

- **Historically, students assigned this week have 90+ hours earned at FSC; apartments are usually filled within the second week.
- *** Based on availability, Community Living may choose to end selection and manually assign students to remaining open bed spaces.

Career Services

The Career Services office will be launching two new online, non-academic Canvas courses to help students stay on track with their career readiness and towards their post-graduation career goals.

The **FSC Career Guarantee** is an online, non-credit Canvas course for first year, first-time-in-college (FTIC) students and consists of modules that students will sign-up for and enroll in during their first year and follow along all four years of college. Enrolled students will participate in a four-year structured sequence of career preparation activities. Students who complete all program requirements are guaranteed a job or graduate school placement within six months of graduation.

The **Mocs Milestone: Graduation Ready!** is an online, non-credit Canvas course for graduating seniors in their final semester. It provides a place for graduating students to easily locate all of their final

semester, non-academic graduation-related requirements and information in one centralized place. It includes information about the graduation check and application information, two career planning activities, graduating student survey information, commencement information, and more!
